Barriers (Internal and External)	
<p>The fund is designed to support schools in ‘narrowing the attainment gap’. This is because traditionally, children from more disadvantaged households tend to do significantly less well at school when measured by statutory examinations.</p> <p>Common barriers for disadvantaged children can be less support at home, weak language and literacy skills, lack of confidence, more frequent behaviour difficulties and attendance/punctuality issues. There may also be complex family/safeguarding situations that prevent children from flourishing. The challenges will be varied, it is therefore important to see and treat every child as an individual in their own right. Children have significant low attainment on entry to Nursery and Reception, with limited/poor language skills. Fewer disadvantaged children achieve greater depth or exceed age related expectations.</p>
