<p>Barriers The fund is designed to support schools in ‘narrowing the attainment gap’ this is because, traditionally, children from more disadvantaged households tend to do significantly less well at school when measured by statutory examinations. Common barriers for disadvantaged children can be less support at home, weak language and literacy skills, lack of confidence, more frequent behaviour difficulties and attendance/punctuality issues. There may also be complex family/safeguarding situations that prevent children from flourishing. The challenges will be varied, it is therefore important to see and treat every child as an individual in their own right. We know that our investment in our Pastoral Support Team has supported many vulnerable children and families, ensuring that the children remain in school and thrive both academically and socially.</p>

Lego Zone/After school Lego club	£206	Weekly after school provision run by Behavioural mentor to develop and reinforce play skills and social skills, through collaborative problem solving. Improved behaviour for and attitudes to learning, positive impact on classroom environment reducing low-level disruption.
Pastoral Team – PP/SEN teacher, Behaviour mentor and learning mentor	£54,937	To provide our children with the best possible education we have invested in a pastoral team, consisting of PP/SEN teacher, Behaviour Mentor, Learning Mentor and Pastoral Mentor. The SENCO is a member of the Senior Leadership Team. Learning mentor delivers targeted speech and language programmes and occupational therapy programmes for children. Additional phonics groups daily across the school and booster groups for pupils identified as falling behind.

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		65% of our children have English as an additional language including a significant number who are newly arrived to the UK. Staff employed to provide additional literacy support in comprehension skills for children in years 2, 4 and 5.
Christmas Activities	£20	Vulnerable groups through art and craft activities raise self-esteem and aspirations through providing a small gift which they make for parents/carers.
Dyslexia resources	£338	2% of children in school are screened as dyslexic. Staff support these children 3 times per week with additional targeted support.
