During the lessons on physical changes during adolescence and puberty, the girls and boys will be taught in single sex groups to allow them to ask questions openly. The children will learn about appropriate, accurate and inoffensive vocabulary in a secure, safe and professional classroom environment. (Previously addressed with NSPCC 'Big Talk' (Summer 2019)

The lists of changes that are addressed within the teaching are outline below:

Physical Changes in Girls	Physical Changes in Boys				
Breasts develop; they come in all shapes and sizes.	Testosterone for boys carried in the blood stream and triggers changes				
Hip broaden and waist slims.	Muscles and bones develop				
Ovaries produce oestrogen.	Voice deepens

- First menstruation approximately 12 months after breasts have begun to develop.
- Usually start to grow hair on underarm, pubic area and legs.

- Wet dreams and erections
- Penis and scrotum enlarge.
- Hair can be grown on face, chest, back, arms, as well as under arms and pubic area.
- Production of sperm and discharge of seminal fluid during erection.
- Adam's apple enlarges.
