They perform many duties throughout the year including writing and presenting whole school assemblies, holding collective worships and liturgies for their peers in Key Stage 1 and 2, leading prayer journeys in the labyrinth, assisting in school Masses and maintaining The Retreat.

Our children have the opportunity to explore a captivating curriculum that promotes good attitudes to learning, high standards and high achievement.

We are a two-form entry school with less than 30 pupils in each class. Learning takes place in whole classes and small groups and our school has spacious learning areas for pupils to use to support their learning.

We are a well-resourced school with a library which covers all areas of the curriculum helping to support pupils interests and passions away from the curriculum. We use iPads, laptops, digital cameras and smart boards to deliver our modern, ambitious curriculum.

School visitors regularly comment on our calm, learning environment. Our learning spaces around the school are used in different ways to allow a range of learning to take place, with designated breakout spaces that support individual and curriculum learning needs.

Our school also has an extensive outdoor area which can be used throughout the year for a range of learning activities including our PE curriculum.

Our curriculum

At Saint Augustine Webster, our curriculum aligns with our school mission and values. We provide a curriculum that focuses on both knowledge and skills development. We follow the National Curriculum and ensure that there is a strong focus on improving the skills needed to drive questioning, investigation and understanding challenges.

Our curriculum is ambitious and filled with engaging content. It is based on the latest educational research to make learning easier for pupils by helping them build and retain knowledge and vocabulary. We assess our pupils' progress regularly to identify areas for improvement and ensure there are no gaps in their learning.

Teaching and learning

Our curriculum is extremely engaging and challenging for all pupils. By incorporating the latest research-backed theories in education, we ensure that our curriculum is not only engaging but also tailored to meet the diverse needs of all pupils.

The use of a range of assessment techniques plays a crucial role in enhancing our pupils' development. Through continuous assessment and evaluation, we gather valuable insights into individual strengths and weaknesses. This approach allows us to identify specific areas where pupils may need additional support or challenge.

The Little Wandle Letters and Sounds Program is used by our EYFS (Early Years Foundation Stage) and KS1 (Key Stage 1) pupils to ensure a consistent approach to the teaching of phonics and early reading. Our English and Maths curriculum gives pupils a strong foundation in developing core skills.







The St Augustine Webster curriculum develops knowledge and understanding of the world. RE (Religious Education) and PSHE (Personal, Social, and Health Education) give pupils the opportunity to develop tolerance and empathy towards those from different faiths, beliefs and cultures. As a Catholic community, pupils are reminded of their place in a culturally diverse society.

All pupils are encouraged to support charities which may be local, national or international. E-Safety training and PSHE teaching enables our pupils to make safe choices.

Through our Catholic ethos and virtues, children are aware of how to treat people as individuals with dignity and compassion. We invest heavily in meeting the needs of all our children, by creating equality of opportunity, by knowing and understanding the needs of all children.

Democratic values are central to our ethos in St Augustine Webster. Debate and discussion are regular activities across the curriculum. Adults listen to the views of pupils and value their opinions. Pupils have further opportunity to have their voices heard through our School Council, pupil questionnaires, pupil interviews and book studies.

Pupils are taught to understand the need for laws and rules. The School Council helped to devise the Positive Behaviour Policy that all pupils follow.

Everything we do is based on Gospel values, with the important commandment being 'Love one another as I have loved you.' All pupils are taught the importance of self-respect, honesty, open communication with others and fair play.






At St Augustine Webster, we value the uniqueness of all our pupils and establish an ethos that develops the 'whole child'.

Enrichment activities

There are plenty of opportunities for pupils to have their voices heard. The School Council help the Senior Leadership Team make improvements across school. The Eco Committee are proactive in trying to reduce the school's carbon footprint. The Chaplaincy Team play a big role in developing and maintaining the Catholic life of the school.

There are plenty of opportunities for pupils to 'give back' to the school through service by undertaking responsibilities. Dinner Hall Helpers support younger children in the dinner hall. Playground Leaders provide structured activities for younger pupils at lunchtimes. Reading Ambassadors read to younger children at lunchtimes. Librarians run the school library. Each class has its own class helpers.

We have a wide range of musical instrument tuition including violin, guitar, ukulele, cello, flute and clarinet.

Sporting activities

There are plenty of opportunities for the pupils to represent the school at a range of sports such as football, golf, athletics, dodgeball and rounders.

We also work in partnership with different organisations to provide sporting clubs such as football, badminton, table tennis, benchball, dodgeball, multi-skills, golf and other sporting activities.

Wraparound Care

We offer before and after school care to support working parents. Wraparound Care is provided by our staff who supervise the pupils and can assist them with their homework as well as providing a range of activities before and after school. Care is available for Reception children and above from 8am until 5:30pm.

Wide range of sporting and other interests.


Virtues
